About Urban Forestry

The City of San Diego Urban Forestry program plants, maintains, protects and promotes trees.

- Over 250,000 street trees & ~ 600,000 park trees
- 50,000+ palms & shade trees pruned
- 1,200 park and street trees planted in FY23
- 6,000 Get It Done street tree requests per year
- Emergency tree pruning/removals for public safety






Trees for Communities

- 2022 settlement with Air Pollution Control District to create supplemental environmental project
- \$4.6 million for a multi-year tree planting program.
- Plant new trees, expand existing and create new tree wells
- The City will exhaust all feasible tree planting locations.










What To Expect

Under this program the City will:

- Plant new trees on City owned land.
- Water trees for 3 years and provide Increase planting spaces width ongoing tree maintenance.
- Create new planting spaces in paved parkways.
 - when needed.





Where Are We Now




816 TREES PLANTED IN PRIORITY AREA ONE
